A. Introduction

Governance and leadership department is a strategy implementation framework whose main aim is to establish a stable governance and management structure for the ministry. Together with partnership collaboration and financial sustainability strategies they play a supportive role to the five main pillars of the ministry which include Discipleship, Compassion and Dignity, Mentorship, Stewardship & Integrity and Peace building.

The department also has a financial and administration section whose main aim is to provide oversight, control, management and accountability of ministry resources.

The department envisions a ministry that operates under effective and efficient management principles, and an organizational structure that serves to ensure accountability at all levels of operations.

Currently the ministry has a total of **73** members of staff, **32** being in the children homes, **16** at the head office, **21** in the schools, **1** missionary based in Garsen located at the coast of Kenya, **2** staff working GOA Global University and **1** farm manager in GOA Githabai farm. We also have a bigger team of more than **200** pastors who serve in the churches and **several** volunteers working in the children homes.

B. Financial Performance overview

2022/2023 has been a very successful year compared to the previous year. We have witnessed Gods provision in a huge way both in terms of human and financial resources. Some of the projects that had been our prayer item for quite some time were funded and we are so grateful.

During the year, we also had new partners supporting various departments and some like **GSL** and **Wayne Dorsette ministries** started in person trainings in Kenya. We also had various teams and friends who support us visit the country.

During the year, the ministry's income increased steadily at the rate of **15.5%** compared to the previous financial year 2021/2022. This is attributed to the new partners who came on board and also funding of some of the projects that had been pending for long like the GOA Education Centre Bus and Kieni Borehole. The increase is also attributed to Bishops visit to the United States in the month of November 2022 after cancelling the trip for a while since the onset of Covid Pandemic. We thank God for His provision.

In partnership with International Leadership Institute we also witnessed a huge increase in the in person leaders trainings whose main aim is to accelerate the spread of the gospel.

During the year we received a total **Income** of **Kshs 149,381,284** which is an increase from last financial year whose amount was **Kshs 129,337,351**.

C. Financial Report

i) Income

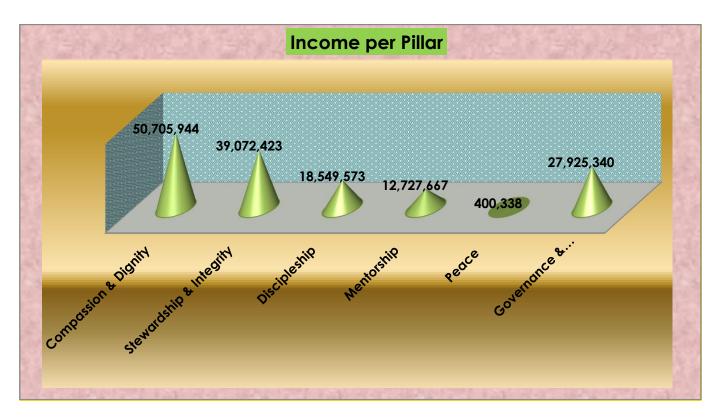
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During the year, we received funds for various projects in the ministry. Consequently compassion received the highest at the rate of **33.94%**, followed by Stewardship & Integrity at **26.16%**, Governance and Leadership Discipleship at **18.69%**, Discipleship at **12.42%**, & Mentorship at **8.52% and** Peace Building department at **0.27%**

Below is a graphical representation of the above



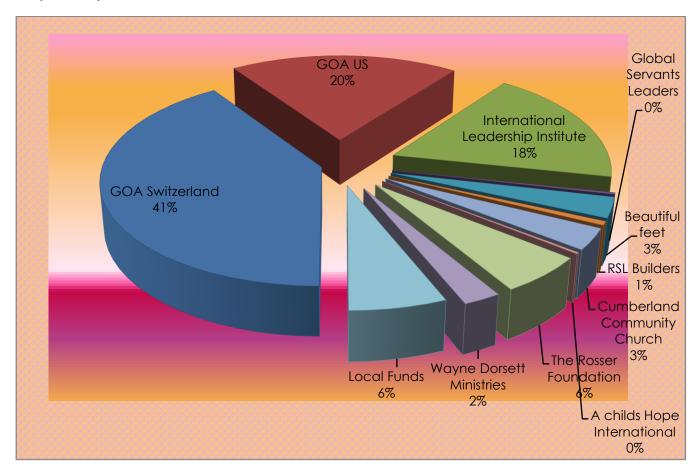
ii) Income Sources

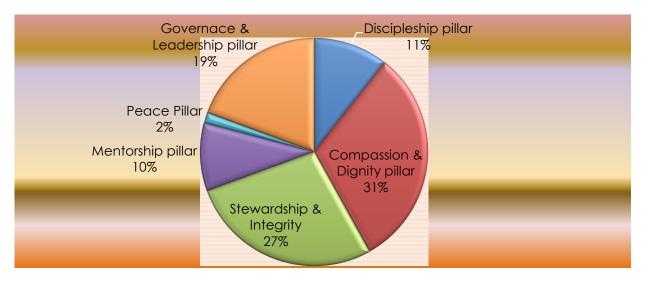

vii) Beyond Kenyan Boarders

Through the years GOA ministry has grown and established churches beyond Kenya boarders which include **Uganda**, **Tanzania**, **Rwanda**, **Burundi**, **DRC Congo**, **South Sudan** and in the near future **Malawi**. However some of these churches have financial obligations that are beyond the limited resources that they have. As a result each church has made plans and budgets that are stated in a separate document.

viii) Conclusion

As finance department we thank our partners and friends who have tirelessly supported the ministry during the year. Together we achieved an upward growth of **15.5%** hence receiving a total income of **Kshs 149,381,284**. The budget for the new financial year **2023/2024** is **KShs 270,859,482** of which **KShs 131,758,101** is in the pending priorities shown in **Table iv**. Our prayer is to be able to achieve all our plans this year all to the Glory of God.
