We are blessed with one baby girl Eliana Furaha who will be turning two years on 1st July 2023. Christale is a nutritionist from Kenya Medical training College and passionate about reaching the community through her profession and sharing the Gospel of Jesus

Our Discipleship Strategies

GOA discipleship pillar was established 32 years ago to creatively respond to the great commission, reaching different target groups with the Gospel. Our teams have used creative strategies of reaching the different groups with the Gospel, these include Sports, Community service and open air preaching meetings, person to person evangelism, and Social media evangelism. As a result of this creativity the number of believers being discipled by GOA congregations has grown drastically to closer to 15000 and more communities now have a church where they can walk to for worship and fellowship. More leaders have been given an opportunity to live their God given purposes through the Growing GOA congregations, as Pastors, church elders and other ministry opportunities. Over the past 32 years GOA has planted 191 churches which are taken care of by 250 Pastors.

The milestones we achieved

GOA mentorship and leadership Summit gave GOA teams an opportunity to look at GOA vision in a new way. In order to improve on the efficiency of the reaching communities with Gospel of Jesus, The GOA regional Overseers have been elevated to the office of GOA Regional Bishops. With this new development GOA regional teams can do more in reaching the communities and equipping Pastors for ministry. We also created more administrative regions to reach 20 administrative regions up from the previous 16 regions.

Empowerment of Pastors



The Pastors in unreached areas travel for long distances to reach their communities with eh Gospel. The blessing of a motorbike to a pastor in Turkana, Samburu Maasai and Tharaka regions is a big miracle to the Gospel. Through the support of Cumberland community church we empowered 3 of our Pastors with a motorbike each. 12 more Pastors still need a Bike to reach the community with the gospel. It costs USD 2000 to

buy one Bike for a Pastor.

DISCIPLESHIP



New believers

Through creative evangelism strategies GOA discipleship teams reached more people with the Gospel of Jesus and close to 550 accepted Jesus are being discipled to maturity in the different congregations. Out of these more than 400 have been baptized through immersion in many waters while the rest are still undergoing the new believers discipleship class and will be baptized in the coming few days.

GOA REGIONAL CONFERENCES

After the long period of Covid Interruptions Goa Teams from across the globe gathered for the Annual conferences. We held all our three conferences, the children conference, youth conference and the family conference together in Gilgil Kenya. More than 1000 members of GOA family gathered for this Historical moment. Thank you for sponsoring delegate to the conference.



Prayer needs and priorities for the current year

Our teams have planned to build 12 new permanent churches in the unreached areas at the cost of \$22,500 and more temporary churches at the cost of \$450 each. Creative evangelism strategies in both reached and unreached areas will cost us an estimated \$12,000 to make more disciples.

Missionary teams support to unreached areas in Kenya and outside the country at a cost of \$7000. The funds will help us send missionary teams to new countries and areas with the goal of evangelizing these communities. Pastors and leaders training and empowerment Seminars that will cost us an estimated \$22000 while 10 motorbikes for Pastors in unreached areas will need \$20,000.

For effective leadership teams we envision a need of USD 13000 to support our discipleship administrative team

by HIV/AIDS. Diseases such as HIV/AIDS and others coupled by the tough economic times have escalated the rate of orphaned children and devastation among families. Goa Compassion teams respond to this need through caring for these children with the support of our friends and partners through Child sponsorship

EDUCATION

The Kenyan system of education returned to normalcy after disruption by the covid19 pandemic. As a result there

were multiple transition grades of the same year both in the Primary school and secondary Schools. 21 of our children sat their primary school Education and were all admitted to different High school while 20 students sat their High School final exam. Transitioning this group of children to their next levels was intensive in financing. We are grateful to our friends and partners that helped us send them to school.



Our children Health

Proper nutrition is key to the physical and cognitive health of our children. We therefore give key emphasis on proper nutrition for our children. Our compassion teams try all our best to provide nutritional diet for the children. There are efforts to grow vegetables and fruits in our homes to provide for the children. Three of our children at Beat The drum Home have attained the triple Zero status, having an undetectable viral load. This is as a results consistent medical appointments and good care. However, 3 children at Tumaini that require monthly clinics at Kenyatta national hospital, Please pray for and support us.

COMPASSION AND DIGNITY

Esther together with her three siblings were abandoned by both parents in a rental house without food ,their maternal grandmother who lived nearby, totally refused to host them when they were force-



fully placed under her care by the area chief. They spent several nights in the cold. This put the child and his siblings in danger of malnutrition, defilement or even death due to Pneumonia which affects young children. Their paternal grandmother who lives miles away, when she was requested to host them, he claimed he was unable due to poverty and financial constraints. The children have not been in school for the past four years yet they have attained the school going

Esther and her siblings are now with us at Rhema children home, they go to school, fed and are age. clothed. Together we can improve lives. We need \$117 to sponsor a child per month provides for their basic needs, education and other developmental needs for the child.

Sustainability projects

Sustainability projects are part of our strategies to



attain food security and provide nutritious food for our children. Each of our homes have adopted а



farming project that provides vegetables and other for our children. These include dairy farming, poul-

try and rabbit farming. These projects were adversely affected by the prolonged drought. Some of them underperformed. However with the return of food that would provide for the nutritional needs the rains we are optimistic that there are good results a head for our children and homes.

Infrastructure

The dream to construct a dining hall at Rehema girls was achieved. This dining hall will be used for all



meals, worship and devotional time every evening, a place to do home work, and a place for skill development. At the same time we were blessed with the gift of a newly drilled borehole at Kieni Home. The water will now be sufficient for the children needs as well as the farming for the home. At Beat The

Drum Home our security challenge has so far been addressed with the erection of a chain link fence around the home. Our projects and children are safe from intruders. We praise God.

<u>Reforms</u>

The Kenyan government recently introduced care reforms strategy known as "changing the way we care." This strategy encourages care for children within families as opposed to the traditional institutions such as homes. The strategy will see Kenya change from institution mode of care to community based care. In view of this the compassion teams are realigning our child care to fit to this new strategy.

<u>Praise</u>

Together with our 34 caregivers, we have accomplished a lot, we wish to register our gratitude to all friends, partners and sponsors for their support together lives were improved. My appeal to you once again is, kindly consider walking with us in 2023/2024 financial year.

COMPASSION AND DIGNITY



My name is John Waithanji, I am 27. I am the third born in a family of six children. I was brought up in a family of a single mother that struggled with basic needs. It is for this reason that I got an opportunity join Rhema children's home. I received all the care and provision to where I am today serving in at the GOA Head office compassion ministry as the Assistant Compassion Director.

What is Foster care?

GOA compassion has cared for hundreds of children through GOA Homes. As the ministry grows our teams are exploring the strategy of community and family care through foster families. In this new model needy children are attached to foster families where they are cared for as members of the families and are supported through supporting their new families which provide for all their needs. Currently we have 27 children attached to foster families some of which are equally in dire need and struggle to meet their own needs but have graciously taken in an extra child or more to care for them.

Foster Children progress

Out of the 27 children 9 of them are in high schools while the rest 18 are in Primary school. Through our friends



and partners, we have paid school fees for all the 9 children in High school and also provided for educational needs for all the others. Through our regular feeding and support for the families over 100 members from these families have benefitted with food and other support home to school and back. The children meet regularly for fellowship and mentorship meetings at The GOA churches

and are helped to grow in their spiritual walk with the Lord Jesus.

Our Priorities and Prayer needs

- 1. We would like to add 5 more children to the foster care program due to the growth of the number of children in need in our communities. This will require \$300 more per month for their needs.
- 2. We also need to sensitize our regional leadership teams to care for more children. Our sensitization initiatives require us \$200.
- 3. We also look forward to extend the care program into mentorship of the young people as they grow in partnership with GOA churches.
- 4. We intend conduct parent's seminar where all the mother in the same region will come together and get some education on parenting in this generation.
- 5. We also would like to continue providing support to the families for food and school fees for the children
- 6. For our teams to effectively care for the children we need \$1500 more for the children and family needs every month.

We appreciate the GOA partners that have helped us care for these children to this far. They all can smile at the future that is waiting for them.

GOA EDUCATION

Education is one of the strategies the GOA has adopted to restore dignity to the less fortunate. To make this goal achievable, GOA has started 5 schools that provide quality education to the needy children and adults. These schools include one High School and four primary schools and one adult school. Three of GOA Primary schools are located among the unreached people in Samburu and Turkana while one Primary school and the GOA High school are located at Tumaini Childrens Home. The GOA Adult education Centre is located among the unreached Turkana people where more than 40 adults have had the opportunity to taste school.

GOA High School

GOA High school currently boats a total of close to 100 students in the four grades. A total of 20 candidates



sat their national examination at the end of last year. Managing to score a mean grade of 2.632 this was noted as good performance having recovered from the Covid 19 disrutions of the Covid season. GOA High School is also the regional champion in athletics in the last regional games after our students posted good performance in the games. Through the help of our partners in Switzerland we built

four new additional classrooms a girls dormitory. With these improved facilities, we have space to admit more students who will study in ample space and accommodate them comfortably in the new dormitory.

GOA Education Centre Kinangop

We currently have 119 children at the school. This has been attributed to the new school bus that we

bought last year through the help of our friends and partners. At the close of last year a total of 21 candidates sate their National Exams at the end of their Primary education in class eight and Grade 6. All the class eight graduates have proceeded to High School while the Grade 6 graduates have all preceded to Junior Secondary School at GOA Education



Centre. This year 20 candidates will sit the KCPE While 7 candidates will sit their grade 6 Evaluation Test.



GOA Adult Education Centre

The Centre currently has 35 adults attending their classes daily. Ten of the learners are ready to sit the KCPE examination at the end of the year and they have been registered. This will be a great milestone for the school and a great encouragement to other learners

GOA EDUCATION

GOA NABWELPUS EDUCATION CENTRE

More than 300 children have had an opportunity to attend school here. Besides the provision of education the



school also provides the children with food, to many of them the only meal in the day. The school has registered the first Class eight candidates class. A total of 7 10 candidates will sit their National exam later this year. However the first Grade six class sat their National assessment exam last year and transitioned successfully to Junior secondary school. We have bought new school uniform for all the children as well as oth-

er learning materials for the children. In addition, God has been faithful to provide for the feeding of the children at the school.



The school started in a structure made of sticks with just a few children from the Samburu community and one volunteer teacher. The school has grown and has a population of 126 children and four teachers. The school is currently preparing to register the first grade 6 class in the coming year. Over the last year we have successfully provided the school with food and learning materials. We look forward to growing the school to admit more children.

Priority needs for year 2023/2024

- i. Our education teams are in need to adequately provide quality education to our children.
- ii. At Tumaini complex we are in need of more room for Junior Secondary students. This is in addition to the other needs of classrooms to accommodate all the 11 grades that we currently have at the school.
- iii. GOA Nabwelipus in Turkana County requires four extra classrooms at the cost of USD. 13,000 to support all the classroom in the school. The children in the school also need food to keep them at school.
- iv. Ngirashi school among the Samburu people is in need of four more classrooms each costing \$12,000 to accommodate all the children in the school The school also needs additional teachers
- v. GOA Adult School is in need of classrooms which would cost \$13,000 each. The only building that the students used for their learning was blown away by strong winds leaving them in the open.
- vi. We are also in need of an extra teacher for the adult school that would require a monthly Salary of \$120. The school adult school also requires teaching materials such as text books and revision books for the candidates estimated to cost \$200.

I have served in Glory outreach Assembly (GOA) since 1992 in various capacities. Currently I am serving in the peace department in the area of family strengthening and handling counseling issues. I am also direct our education teams in charge of GOA schools.

What Our Peace Teams do

GOA Peace teams provide a platform for peace building and conflict resolution, mental health and family strengthening among families churches nations and also individuals. Peace is vital for the effective spread of the Gospel and as a result GOA peace teams place a lot of premium on building a peaceful society for effective evangelism and disciple-

Family strengthening efforts

Our commitment to build strong families has born fruit. Four young couples were joined in Holy matrimony



after successful premarital counseling sessions. One more couple that had been married for some time also took the challenge to renew their marriage vows and acquire their marriage certificates. Our teams at regional and church levels held marriage seminars to empower couples in the life long journey as well as couples' retreats that gave spouses

rare opportunities to spend quality time together and learn from other couples. As a result many of our marriages are getting more strengthened and happy together.

Group counseling

We held group counseling sessions for different groups around the GOA Regions. These included women counseling sessions in Kenya and DRC Congo during which the GOA women branded the women ministry



as the GOA Blessed women with the newly designed head scarfs. The 305 participants have gone a long way in helping us build strong women ministries in our churches and regions. We also held the annual RIPEN counseling sessions for the young boys and girls. 36 young people were equipped with life skills and counsel as they transition to High schools to deal with their life issues while another

group of 95 was equipped in our post secondary and secondary students seminar in Nairobi. These groups have also included our children in the eight GOA Homes that need psychosocial support.

PEACE

With the rising trends in metal health needs, our team has incorporated Simon Ndirangu, an alumni from Tumaini children home that specializes in addressing mental health issues in our communities. Simon has been instrumental in helping both young and old people cope with situations that require mental health support.



I am Simon Ndirangu, 27 years of age alumni of Tumaini children's home, where I have been brought up and educated. I have pursued my Bachelors degree in Social work from Moi University which has nurtured my passion for mental health. My childhood experiences which constituted of grief, discrimination, rejection and poverty meant I underwent so much psychological turmoil. I developed a passion to not only help people going through the same but also educate people to create a safe environment for all.

Our mental health Initiatives

This year we got more intentional as we initiated the Mental Health Program as a strategic response to the societal needs and a way to win souls for Christ and help in maturing disciples. Our community has historically been naive in matters Mental Health. As a result we have reached more than 1000 households with mental health awareness and support through house to house campaigns. More than 500 young people from our community have been reached and helped to cope with mental health issues through one-on-one meetings as well as group outreach forums.

With the society now slow accepting that mental issues are key many members of the community are now reaching out to our team seeking help with their children friends and themselves.

TOP PRIORITIES AND PRAYER NEEDS FOR PEACE TEAMS

- a) There are a number of couples that are already being prepared for their marriages. We pray for strong marriages.
- b) Our teams have undertaken renovation exercise at the GOA Peace Centre in Kinangop to put the Centre to good use as rehabilitation Centre as well as sustainability projects. This projected to cost \$15,000
- c) Our counseling teams are also in need of \$840 to help facilitate monthly counseling sessions in our homes. We also look forward to conducting the RIP-

EN counseling program for our young children at the end if the year. This is projected to require up to \$2200 for a successful counseling session that will impact our young people and prepare them for their next levels.

d) Our mental health teams has put plans in place to engage different groups in a drive to create and raise mental health awareness and initiate support programs for the communities. The team projects a need of \$10,800 for a successful mental health drive awareness and support

STEWARDSHIP AND INTEGRITY



My name is Rev. Phyllis Wangechi Githaiga. The Director of Leadership Training and Development. I am a mother of two boys; Alpha Baraka 14 years, Alvis Baraka 9 years, and a foster mother of one girl called Sarah Galgallo 15 years. I also Pastor Glory Outreach Assembly Murera church. A newly planted church that is still under construction as the Lord provides.

At GOA, we recognize the importance of training and mentoring leaders to nurture equitable, just and peaceful communities. Just like Christ calls us to discipleship, GOA works with members to mentor and train leaders especially among youthful congregants who will take up the leadership mantle and sustain the future God- fearing and loving communities. In the leadership department, we help members discover, develop and deploy their spiritual gifts to help fulfil the great commission. To realize the vision for leader-ship training and development, GOA works in partnership with International Leadership Institute (ILI), GOA Switzerland, Nairobi Pentecostal Bible College (NPBC) and Daily word feast foundation (CBR).

ILI History Makers

3,860 leaders have been trained in the English Swahili Africa region and they are spreading the gospel



within their nations. The Nation of Somaliland has been penetrated with the history makers training and the underground Christians encouraged to share the gospel in their nation. Other national Teams have been empowered with projectors to make it easy for them during training.

GOA Global University (GGU)

This college aims at empowering people with skills in line with their vision and passion. Currently the col-



lege is offering theology to ministers with a call to serve God in the area of church planting and discipleship, with plans to introduce Computer classes. There is a plan to also introduce computer courses to help the community develop into the digital world. Three Theology schools are ongoing in three GOA regions with a total of 57 stu-

dents devoted to study for effective ministry. The main campus in Tharaka has been facelifted with boarding facilities to accommodate students who travel from far places. The other Satellite centers in Kinamba Laikipia and Nairobi meet one Saturday per month for the classes. From the college, 32 churches have been planted and two more Bible training centers started by the alumni. Our former students are now more equipped to rightly divide the word of truth.

Consistent Bible Reading CBR

CBR aims at helping Christians to develop the discipline of consistent Bible reading. Reading it systematically and meditatively with an aim of getting daily instructions from the Lord. It also teaches scripture memory skill and how



to pray back the scripture to God. Two classes graduated within the year in Kangemi with 9 students and Murera with 20 students. Other classes are in progress in Tharaka, Murera, and Kahawa Wendani. The ongoing classes has a total of 50 students who are passionately learning the discipline becoming consistent bible readers. CBR has also come to lay a firm foundation in the

living word of God. The alumni of the program testifies that they are now reading the bible daily aiming to develop their intimacy with God as opposed to waiting for others to read the Bible for them.

HEART FOR PASTORS SEMINAR



Heart for pastors' seminar is a ministry by Dr. G Wayne Dorsett for equipping pastors and ministers of the gospel. More than 400 ministers attended the training and testified about the life transforming experience they encountered at the conference both in Nairobi and Bungoma.

GLOBAL SERVANT LEADERS SEMINAR



The GSL seminar was held between 28-31 August at Ukombozi retreat center with Dr. Carey Akin. 26 key GOA leaders who learnt the keys to leading others through service by going deeper in their relationship with God and others. The group has since then walked through the journey together as they encourage and follow the principles learnt.

Our Priority and focus for the coming year





During the 2022/2023 fiscal year we have witnessed Gods provision in a huge way. Our Financial performance

During the year we received a total Income of Kshs 149,381,284 which is an increase from last financial year whose amount was Kshs 129,337,351. Consequently compassion received the highest at the rate of 33.94%, followed by Stewardship & Integrity at 26.16%, Governance and Leadership Discipleship at 18.69%, Discipleship at 12.42%, & Mentorship at 8.52% and Peace Building department at 0.27%.

During the year the ministry spent 28% of its resources in capital expenditure. This means that the ministry is growing in a positive way in terms of increasing its asset net worth.



Sustainability Projects

Githabai farm is one of the Agribusiness projects that GOA has adopted to nurture towards financial sustainability. The farm features crop and animal farming through the sales of which the ministry looks forward to grow the local revenue. We intend to install Drip irrigation system and drill a borehole on the property at an estimated cost of USD 36,000 to sustain all the farming activities on the farm.

Besides the agribusiness project GOA ministry has also invested in other business opportunities such as Mobilize money transfer Internet café and mineral water processing. These projects are well underway as e look forward to better results in future.



Hospitality and Rental Project

Our Vision for sustainability has grown further with the ministry considering venturing in Hospitality Industry and rental property. It is estimated that putting up a modern Guest house in Naivasha will cost the ministry an estimated USD. 120,000 where we shall host our Conferences and training events while we generate income from the facility. The Costs for building our proposed rental houses in Umoja Estate Nairobi are still underway


